



Frequently Asked Questions

Courtesy pick ups

Please be ready at your accommodation at least 5 minutes prior to pick up times. These may vary due to weather or traffic conditions.

What's the climate like in Australia?

Australia is a large place and climates vary. In Victoria weather conditions change rapidly especially along the Great Ocean Road and in the Otways. You should be prepared for hot, cold, wet and dry conditions.

How much luggage can I bring?

On multi day tours we travel with a trailer for luggage, but space is limited, so please keep luggage to one bag of approx 15 kg and a small day pack.

Do I need any special clothing?

Yes things etc are not suitable for walking on tracks so good quality walking shoes/boots are required. The weather can vary throughout Victoria so clothing for hot and cold conditions should be packed.

How much walking is there?

Our tours include some walking, especially on multi day tours.

Walks range from between 30 minutes to 1.25 hours and some will involve climbing stairs. These would be rated as medium difficulty so you should be prepared to put in some effort.

How much water do I need?

It is advised that 6 – 8 glasses of water be drunk daily and this would need to increase in extreme heat or physical activity. We supply ample water for multi day tours.

What should I pack?

- Sturdy walking shoes or boots for walking
- Appropriate clothing for warm & cold conditions
- Sunscreen, hat & toiletries
- Insect repellent
- Camera



- Water Bottle
- Swimming gear and towel (optional)
- Torch (optional)

What do I eat?

We like to supply our guests with fresh wholesome food of the highest quality and endeavour to give a wide variety of choice where possible.

Breakfast and lunch will be at local cafes.

Evening meals may be supplied by the accommodation provider or you can eat at a choice of outlets in overnight towns.

Do we pay for permits?

No all permit costs are included in the cost of the tour.

What about toilet breaks?

Ample toilet stops are allowed for and in extreme emergencies the “old bush dunny” is always close by.

Can I smoke and drink on the vehicle?

Australian Government regulations prohibit smoking and the drinking of alcohol inside tourist vehicles in Australia. Smoking is allowed at most rest points and alcohol should be limited to lunch and the end of the day.
